This initiative has been undertaken to commemorate the 47th International Museum Day, as part of the second phase of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. The event will offer a platform for museum professionals and enthusiasts to exchange ideas, insights and promote cross-cultural learning and understanding.

The Honourable Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi will be inaugurating the International Museum Expo 2023. Government functionaries, Museum professionals and aligned service-technology providers, Academicians, and School & College students from the National to the Community level will also grace the occasion with their presence.

During the three-day International Museum Expo, there will be a focus on various themed museums, which will be explored through workshops, seminars, masterclasses, panel discussions, and other events. International museum professionals, diplomats, curators, consultants, academicians, and students from various fields across the world are invited to participate in these activities, providing a unique opportunity for cross-disciplinary learning and collaboration.

Speaking on the occasion, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Culture, Mugdha Sinha said, "It is a tremendous opportunity to be able to organize an International Museum Expo to initiate an all-around conversation with museum stakeholders and professionals as a way to incorporate recommendations for policy-

making around museums and for curating museums formed on people programming and museum professionals in a synergistic and comprehensive way."

One of the key features of the expo are the 7 masterclasses and 11 panel discussions that will take place across the three days. The Masterclasses are talks on specific subject matter relating to the functioning of museum spaces led by global experts in a lec-dem format. The panel discussions feature Indian and international museum experts and consultants featuring topics such as unconventional museums, curating for everyone, and financial and environmental sustainability in museums.

Additionally, there are three exhibitions being featured at the Expo, Art & Culture: Celebrating Indian Museums, Sustainability & Wellbeing, Exhibition of 500 Book Covers of Books on Museums, and an Exhibition of Ragamala Paintings. The Art & Culture: Celebrating Indian Museums is an exhibition that brings together artefacts in digital and physical format from 20+ museums across the country, each of whom have contributed iconic artefacts from their collections.
